
It has been an successful year for the ministry, despite the challenges and limitations present during pandemic conditions. Over the course of the year, LCMNU has hosted (virtually, of course):

...and many other opportunities for fellowship, connection, and pastoral care, none of which happen without your support. You are the rock in the lives of all the students impacted by this remarkable ministry.


