

We were to believe like Lutherans, behave like Jews and sing like the Baptists. Mac was direct and sure. God comes to us; making us holy. The Eucharist is celebrated by all the hosts of heaven. God calls his holy ones to work in secular places. It is there we address the cornerstone question: "How do we proclaim Christ in a world where God is dead?" Grace, renewal, power, humility, community—made real by Mac, his wife Sue and the students and alumni who attended ULC 1975-1980. Alleluia.
