Ministry Highlights

- ◆ The first worship service of the academic year was September 20th, with the happy situation of needing to bring in more and more chairs to the worship space, as students kept arriving.
- An outdoor worship service on October 4th was warmed by a fire in the new fire pit, which also made for a unique fellowship time that included great hotdogs and s'mores.
- ♦ Wednesday Supper Worship and 21Theo have nearly doubled in attendance (25+)! It's straining the seating and the budget in all the very best ways. A home-cooked meal, a time to be among friends, a discussion about faith and life questions that matter led by the student ministers—in a competitive academic and social environment, it's midweek respite at its best.
- ◆ The annual First-Day-of-Classes BBQ had lots of current and new students connecting over burgers in the front yard on a beautiful evening. The next evening it was bonding over ice cream sundaes and game night (always eagerly anticipated!). A great first week.
- The Summer Celebration Fundraiser for hospitality, retreats and fellowship has raised muchneeded funds and has been especially necessary in providing an abundant welcome and the opportunity to include all interested students in all programming.
- ◆ Monday night tutoring at Immanuel, Chicago, is thriving and through LCMNU, student tutors are now providing ESL instruction for parents whose children are involved in the program.
- ◆ An article about the three campus ministries in the Chicago area was published in the Metro Chicago fall insert for *The Lutheran* magazine and featured photos from LCMNU.

- ◆ LCMNU was host for the September meeting for rostered leaders in the Northeast Conference of Metro Chicago. Sharing news and hospitality is strengthening our relationships with area congregations and encouraging needed financial support and partnerships for the ministry.
- ◆ Recent support from congregations has included significant gifts from St. John's, Lincolnwood and members of Immanuel, Evanston; a work day provided by Trinity, Evanston; and Wednesday meals from Holy Cross, Libertyville, Trinity, and Immanuel.
- ◆ LCMNU's place in the global and national church is being defined through guest preaching by Joseph Young (Young Adults in Global Mission, Mexico, 2014) and the Rev. Tammy Dahlvang '93 (Homecoming Weekend).
- ◆ LCMNU continues to provide meals and fellowship to Hilda's Place transitional shelter and to collaborate with Evanston-area faith communities on Bridges to Home, an effort to attain housing for young adults in homeless situations.
