## Ministry Highlights

- 2015 is proving to be a busy year! In January and February, Wednesday night discussions included a Bible study series on Job and Ecclesiastes and during 21theo, we discussed denominational identities, expansive language, and wealth distribution.
- A Mardi Gras party and a few game nights have provided some fun fellowship opportunities for all!
- We had a strong response to our fall #commitment campaign, raising more than \$30,000 to help the ministry move toward financial stability.
- Wednesdays during Lent we enjoyed a simplified Supper Worship. Also, each week we invited guests from the social service agencies where we volunteer to join us for a meal and to share about their work. Bible studies followed each Supper Worship relating our baptismal call of "serving all people and striving for justice and peace" to themes of hospitality, shared economics, and a common life.
- Student Ministers will again be preaching during the spring quarter (other students have been co-preaching occasionally with Pastor Deanna on Sundays!), and we're currently in the midst of a Bible study series called "Dinner with Jesus"—examining Jesus' words and actions at meals.
- Through an initiative called "Setting the Table," we are partners with area congregations in addressing homelessness for young adults in Evanston. Conversations will soon become actions.
- Students continue to tutor every week at a local ELCA congregation and serve monthly meals at a local transitional shelter.

- ELCA connections: Four students will be attending the Metro Chicago Synod Assembly in May. Miriam Bohlmann Kunz, was selected to work with "Lutheran Campus Ministry Builds" at the ELCA Youth Gathering in July, and Sarah Van Cleve will be working at Lutherdale Ministries this summer.
- The LCMNU Board of Directors is creating "Purposes and Possibilities," a think tank composed of a variety of people who can help us dream and plan for LCMNU's immediate and long-term future.
- Sunday, April 12 was truly a special day at LCMNU as Pastor Deanna baptized Katie Martini and affirmed Sarah Van Cleve's baptism. We were blessed to have several guests and family members present for this important occasion.
